


MIDWINTER JICKER X 7 = CLASSIX SKEIGHT


Schedule of Events

- 10:30 AM Scott Andrews, a writer and researcher with the Ski Museum will be at the Stockholm Community School to survey the entire history of Maine skiing, from its beginnings with Swedish immigrants in Aroostook County in 1870 to the present day. Using dozens of historic photographs, Mr. Andrews will cover such varied subjects as the winter carnivals of the 1920s and 1930s, early rope tows in Western Maine (including one in Bethel), and the growth of today's large-scale resorts.
- 11:00 AM Registration for skiing begins at the Stockholm School. Registration is \$5 per skier or \$10 per family. Registration fee gets you a long-sleeved T-shirt, a commemorative rose, and entry into our prize raffle.
- Noon Classical Mixed Relay Races Begin. All relays will be run with two-person teams, one female and one male. Mix or match ages – grampy and granddaughter, husband and wife, brother and sister, any “sweetie” combo works. Don't have a partner? We'll do our best to dig one up for you. Other questions?
